Focal points in August

China

A large part of the country was affected by the arrival of several **tropical storms** and heavy, rain especially in **Beijing**, where there were reports of tens of people dead and more than 80,000 people evacuated.

Colombia

Renewed armed violence has been seen in the country, following political tension after it was announced that Senator Miguel Uribe, candidate in the 2026 presidential race, had died from the injuries he sustained when he was shot during a public meeting in Bogota 11 June.

Ivory Coast

Tensions running high ahead of the ballot, with presidential election applications admissible in **Abidjan** until 26 August (opposition demonstrations, President Ouattara filing his candidacy for a 4th term in office).

Indonesia

Emergence of a mass protest movement led by trade unions, including clashes between the police and demonstrators outside parliament in Jakarta (25 & 28 August). Tensions exacerbated by the death of a rideshare driver, run over by a police vehicle 28 August, spreading to other cities. 3 dead in violent clashes at the regional council of Makassar, South Sulawesi (29 August).

Israel/ Palestine Renewed anti-government national protest movement in demand of the release of the hostages, in protest against Israel's plan to conquer Gaza City (clashes, roadblocks and rail disruption, especially in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem (6, 9, 17, 20, 24, 26, 30 August). Gaza Strip: intensification of Israeli operations, particularly around Gaza City. Ongoing Israeli raids, notably near humanitarian aid centres (7, 9, 16, 31 August), on a hospital in Khan Yunis (25 August, 20 dead including journalists, with 6 killed in targeted gunfire in 10 August).

Countries to monitor in September

Guinea

5 September: demonstrations led by the opposition against the junta, followed by a constitutional referendum 21 September – Security reinforcements and tension should be expected.

France

10 and 18 September: calls for a national protest movement to bring the country to a standstill in protest against Prime Minister François Bayrou's budget – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Malawi

16 September: presidential and legislative elections – Security reinforcements, risk of demonstrations and tension.

Gabon

27 September: first round of the legislative and local elections.




28 September: legislative elections – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected, especially in the event of attempted foreign interference.

Summaryof Alerts

+908 alerts +37 classified critical or urgent In August 2025, SSF issued a total of **908 safety–security alerts** concerning all kinds of risks in order to inform its customers of the latest events likely to have an impact on their interests and the safety or security of their employees throughout the world. The alerts covered **147 countries**.

37 of the alerts were classified as either **critical or urgent**, which specifically activate our 24–hour Security Operations Centre (SOC).






10 countries to monitor



The countries that accounted for the highest number of alerts sent by SSF in August 2025 are the **Pakistan**, **Mexico**, the **Democratic Republic of the Congo**, **Indonesia**, **Nigeria**, **China**, **Israel and the Palestinian Territories**, **Colombia**, **Bangladesh** and **Ivory Coast**.

In total, these 10 countries generated **174 safety–security alerts**, representing **19%** of all the alerts sent over the last month.

Countries engaged in long–term warfare or with extremely high levels of insecurity in general (Afghanistan, Libya, Syria, Yemen, Somalia, Sudan and Ukraine) have been deliberately excluded from the list.

Bangladesh

Dhaka: as the country marked the first anniversary of the 2024 student demonstrations that led to the ousting of former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina (5 August), all public rallies banned by the city police (DMP) in some parts of the capital from 8 August. DMP issued traffic restrictions due to the different events (3 August). Injuries reported in clashes between students and police outside the chief adviser's residence, as well as between students from Dhaka College and City College (27 August). Demonstrations staged by the Jamaat-e-Islami party (12, 13 August) and the National Citizen Party (NCP, 3 August) in demand of the implementation of the July Charter. Student rally by the Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD, 3 August). Demonstration led by the United People's Bangladesh party (UP Bangladesh, 1 August) - Nationwide: gatherings to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the assassination of the founding president of the country, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman (15 August).

China

A large part of the country affected by heavy rain. Gansu Province: at least 13 dead and 30 people missing around Lanzhou (7-8 August). Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region: flood waters in Urad Rear Banner, at least 8 dead and 4 people missing (16 August). Beijing: tens of people dead and 82,000 evacuated (4 August), red alert issued for heavy rain and flash-flooding in the northeast of the city until 6 August -Tropical Storm Kajiki hits the island of Hainan and the city of Sanya, typhoon red alert, around 20,000 people evacuated (24 August). Typhoon Yangliu/Podul in the provinces of Fujian and Guangdong 13 and 14 August, followed by Guangxi, Jiangxi, Hunan et Guizhou 14 and 15 August. Temporary suspension of rail and maritime services in Guangdong Tropical Storm Co-May hits Hefei, provinces of Anhui, Jiangsu, Shandong and the Liaodong Peninsula on alert until 2 August. Tropical Storm 17W in the south (17-20 August) -South China Sea: collision between a Chinese naval vessel and a Chinese coast guard boat when pursuing a Philippine patrol ship near the Scarborough Shoal (11 August).

- **Guangdong Province**: chikungunya epidemic reported in Foshan (18 August) - **Tianjin**: Shanghai Cooperation Organisation Summit (31 August - 1 September).

Colombia

Renewed armed violence seen in the country in relation to political tension following the announcement of the death of Senator Miguel Uribe, candidate in the 2026 presidential elections, following the injuries he sustained during a public meeting in Bogota 11 June. Departments of Antioquia and Valle del Cauca: security stepped up following coordinated attacks 21 August (at least 18 dead), including on targeting a police helicopter in Amalfi and another involving a car bomb near an air base in Cali. Drone attacks on a naval patrol in the region of Buenaventura attributed to the Estado Mayor Central (EMC, FARC dissidents), in which at least 3 soldiers were killed (12 August). Central Amazonia: 34 soldiers taken hostage by the EMC rebels (26 August) - Bilateral tension with Peru over a border dispute following the arrest of 2 Colombian land surveyors on the island of Santa Rosa (12 August) -Nationwide: demonstrations in support of former President Alvaro Uribe Vélez, sentence to 12 years in prison (7 August). Bolivar, Magdalena and Sucre departments: strike action and blockades by farmers in defence of the land transfer process (25-27 August). Boyaca Department: blockades in protest against government policy in the mining industry from 4 August - Magdalena Department: major flooding in Santa Marta since 30 July - Bolivar Department: water cuts reported in Cartagena after a pipe burst (9 August).

Democratic Republic of the Congo

North Kivu Province: 11 dead in attacks against the Armed Forces of the DRC (FARDC) attributed to the Allied Democratic Forces (ADF) in Oicha (16-17, 26 August) and 52 dead in the territories of Beni and Luberon (9-16 August). Fighting between the AFC-M23 and the FARDC reported in the territories of Walikale and Rutshuru, leaving at least 8 civilians dead in Nyamilima (8-11 August). Fighting between the AFC-M23 and Wazalendo militiamen leaves 4 dead in the territories of Masisi and Rutshuru (4 August).

The United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights condemns the continued violence by the M23, despite the signed ceasefire (6 August). US diplomatic authorities warn of a risk of terrorist attacks targeting places of worship (20 August). Armed robberies in Sake (8-9 August) - South Kivu: 5 dead in attacks by the Wazalendo against the FARDC in Kamimvira (26 August). Several villages captured by the M23 in Walungu Territory during fighting with the FARDC (8-11 August). 5 dead in heavy rain in Bukavu (10-11 August) - Ituri: at least 6 dead in attacks by the Convention for Popular Revolution (CRP) against the FARDC in Djugu Territory (7-8 August), 3 dead in attacks by the ADF in Irumu Territory (2-3 August) - Maniema: curfew imposed in Kindu following clashes between security forces and the Wazalendo (14 August) -Kongo-Central: clashes between police and demonstrators in Boma (28 August) - Kwilu: 47 prisoners escape from Idiofa central prison (9-10 August) - Kinshasa: former minister Constant Mutamba convicted by the courts. Demonstrations calling for the release of an activist lawyer (22, 14 August), led by employees of EquityBCDC bank and municipal councillors (13 August), and staged by university lecturers (27 August).

Ivory Coast

Tension in the run up to the presidential elections with applications admissible in Abidjan until 26 August (crackdown on opponents, incumbent President Ouattara's bid for a fourth term in office). Opposition demonstrations by the Common Front and "Enough is Enough" movements (30 August), the PPA-CI, the Ivorian Popular Front (FPI) opposition parties (16 August), the Democratic Party of Ivory Coast (PDCI-RDA) and the African People's Party of Ivory Coast (PPA-CI) (9 August). Kidnapping of six activists and arrest of two PPA-CI party officials (2, 8 August) - Bounkani egion: four dead and one missing in an attack by unidentified individuals in Difita near the Burkinabe border (24-25 August) - **Tougbo** sub-prefecture: abduction of six civil servants by Burkina Faso army auxiliaries (VDP) in the village of Kalan (24 August) - Bouaké: military parade marking the 65th anniversary of independence in the presence of military representatives from partner countries (7 August).

Indonesia

Emergence of a mass protest movement led by trade unions, including clashes between security forces and demonstrators outside parliament in Jakarta (25, 28 August). Tensions flared and spread to other cities following the death of a motorcycle taxi driver who was run over by a police vehicle 28 August. Three people died in violent clashes at Makassar City Council in South Sulawesi Province (29 August) - Nusa Tenggara Province: several eruptions of the Lewotobi Laki-Laki volcano (1, 17, 29 August), ash columns resulted in the temporary closure of Frans Xavier Seda Airport (17 August), alert level 3 after being raised to 4 (out of 4) -West Sumatra Province: double eruption of Merapi volcano (27 August), alert maintained at level 2 - Central Sulawesi Province: earthquake measuring 6.0 strikes north of Poso, leaving at least 29 people injured (17 August). Papua Province: earthquake measuring 6.3 strikes west-north-west of Abepura, no tsunami alert issued (12 August).

Israel/Palestine

Israel: renewed nationwide anti-government protests in demand of the release of the hostages in protest against the announcement of an Israeli plan to conquer the city of Gaza (clashes, roadblocks and rail disruptions, particularly in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem, 6, 9, 17, 20, 24, 26, 30 August) -Interception of ballistic missiles fired from Yemen, targeting Ben Gurion Airport among other targets (1, 14, 17, 23, 27 August), some claimed by the Houthis, minor damage reported. Israeli bombing in response against Houthi targets in Sana'a (Yemen), killing at least 10 people, including the Houthi prime minister (24, 28 August) - Northern District: 2 people injured in a criminal shooting in Acre (17 August) - Southern District: criminal explosion of a vehicle in Ashkelon (19 August) - Gaza Strip: intensification of Israeli operations, particularly around Gaza City. Ongoing Israeli raids, notably near humanitarian aid centres (7, 9, 16, 31 August), on a hospital in Khan Yunis (25 August, 20 dead including journalists, 6 of whom were targeted in Gaza 10 August). Targeted assassination of Hamas spokesperson (31 August). West Bank: rare Israeli military incursions into the centre of Ramallah and Nablus from the 27 August (dozens injured).

Mexico

Guanajuato State: 32 bodies found in an abandoned house in Irapuato during an investigation into missing persons (4 August) - Quintana Roo: union leader shot dead by two armed men in Cancun (4 August) - Nuevo Leon: 12 armed men shot dead in a clash between criminals and security forces in Doctor Coss (22 August) - **Veracruz**: 8 dead in violent riot at Tuxpan prison (2 August) - Nationwide: severe weather linked to the wet season, particularly in Mexico City (from 6 August), leading to the suspension of operations at Benito Juarez International Airport (10 August) and power cuts in Mexicali (Baja California, 26 August). Tropical storm Ivo (6-9 August) mainly affecting the west and south of the country. 2 deaths due to flooding in Querétaro (Querétaro State, 24 August) and disruption in Guadalajara (Jalisco, 20 August) - Mexico City: one person injured in a shooting in the Centro district (26 August). 2 people injured when a lift collapsed at the Plaza Mitikah shopping centre (12 August) - Tabasco: explosion and fire at the Plaza Altabrisa shopping centre in Villahermosa (4 August) -Guerrero: residents block the Mexico City-Acapulco motorway near Tierra Colorada (6 August) - Various demonstrations. including in Mexico City for LGBTQ+ rights (23), for the disappeared (30 August) and against the government (31 August), as well as a feminist demonstration in Chihuahua (24 August).

Nigeria

Zamfara State: 13 members of the security forces killed in an ambush by armed men in Adabka (8 August); army operations carried out in Makakkari in retaliation, neutralising around 100 bandits (10 August). 50 people kidnapped by bandits in Sabon Garin Damri (1 August). 15 dead when a passenger boat capsized while fleeing criminal attacks in Gummi (29 August) - Katsina and Borno States: bandits attack a mosque in Unguwan Mantau (13 dead, 19 August). 35 jihadists killed in military air strikes near the border with Cameroon 23 August, resulting in the rescue of 76 kidnapped victims and one hostage killed - Lake Chad Region: increased risk of attacks following the Nigerien army's announcement that it had neutralised the leader of the Boko Haram jihadist group in an operation on Shilawa Island 15 August, denied by the group.

- Benue and Taraba States: 6 students found after being abducted on the Jootar-Wukari road (1 August) - Sokoto State: more than 40 people missing after boat capsizes (17 August) - Yobe State: people injured and disruption due to flooding in Potiskum since 15 August - Niger State: train derailed on the Abuja-Kaduna line near Jere (26 August) - Kaduna State: explosions following a collision between two tankers near Zaria (11) - Nationwide: anti-government protests (1 August) at public universities (26 August) - Abuja: announcement of the arrest of two leaders of the Ansaru jihadist group in a targeted operation (16 August). Power outage following a technical failure (10 August). Nurses' strike until the 5 August - Lagos: roadblock near the international airport (11 August).

Pakistan

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province: at least 344 dead in monsoon flooding, curfew (until the 21 August) and mass evacuation orders (16 August) in Bajaur District. Attacks against security forces leave at least 3 dead in Hangu district (25 August), one dead in Takhti Khel (8 August), 10 dead in Wana, 4 dead in Garaji (Karak district), and 3 dead on the Warsak road in Peshawar (6 August) - Balochistan Province: at least 9 dead in an attack on public buildings in Washuk district (11 August), 3 dead in an attack on a security forces vehicle in Mastung district (5-6 August) - Punjab Province: at least 30 dead in monsoon **flooding** (30 August). Several trains derailed, causing at least one fatality near Lodhran railway station (17 August), 4 people injured in Raiwind (11 August) and 27 injured near Kala Shah Kaku (1 August) - Gilgit Baltistan Region: landslide in Danyor Nullah, at least 7 fatalities (11 August) - Karachi: 3 dead in celebratory gunfire during Independence Day celebrations (14 August). Explosion and fire at a fireworks warehouse on MA Jinnah Road (21 August). Jamaat-e-Islami party march (31 August) - Nationwide: demonstrations announced by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) for the second anniversary of the imprisonment of former Prime Minister Imran Khan, demanding his release; dozens of arrests reported (5 August).

Events to look out for in September

Until 14 September

Spain: Tour of Spain - Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected along the whole route, especially during pro-Palestine demonstrations.

1 to 6 September

Belarus: military manoeuvres within the framework of the Collective Security Treaty Organisation (CSTO).

1 September

China: meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) in Tianjin. **Guyana**: general elections – Security reinforcements should be expected. **Poland**: 86th anniversary of the start of the Second World War when the German troops entered Poland (1939) – Remembrance services likely **Uzbekistan**: Independence Day (1991).

United States: Labour Day demonstration against billionaires – Security reinforcements should be expected, risk of unrest. Disruption likely on the occasion of the federal holiday.

2 September onwards

Morocco: national strike and demonstrations in Rabat led by higher education staff led by the National Union of Higher Education Staff and University Residences.

2 September

Armenia: demonstration in condemnation of the operation carried out by Azerbaijan in 2023 to take control of the disputed Artsakh region (Nagorno-Karabakh) – A turnout of several thousand people is expected.

Brazil: Supreme Court set to examine the judgment against former President Jair Bolsonaro, facing charges of attempted coup.

Japan: 80th anniversary of Japan's surrender ending the Second World War – Commemorations possible.

Nicaragua: anniversary of the creation of the Nicaraguan army (1979). **Vietnam**: Independence Day (1945) and anniversary of the death of Vietnamese

leader, President Ho Chi Minh (1969) - Commemorations likely.

3 to 28 September

Portugal: national strike by ground staff demanding better pay and working conditions – Air traffic disruption should be expected.

3 September

Bulgaria: opposition demonstration in Sofia – Security reinforcements should be expected.

China: Victory Day over Japan in the Second World War (1945), including a military parade on Place Tiananmen – Localised disruption should be expected.

San Marino: National Day.

4 to 6 September

Italy: nationwide multi-sector strike — Disruption affecting air traffic, freight, passenger and public transport should be expected, associated demonstrations should not be ruled out.

India: trade union demonstration in New Delhi – Large turnout and disruption should be expected.

United States: UN General Assembly meeting on Ukraine.

5 to 11 September

United Kingdom: London Underground workers set to go on strike over wage demands and working conditions – Tube disruption should be expected.

5 September onwards

Guinea: opposition demonstrations against the junta – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

5 September

Greece: civil society demonstration in Thessaloniki – Security reinforcements and localised disruption possible.

Iran: deadline for undocumented Afghan citizens to leave the country.

Samoa: announcement of the election results – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected, tension should not be ruled out.

Singapore: first session of the new parliament, when the president will lay out the government's priorities.

Spain: firefighters set to demonstrate in Grenada over better working conditions – Localised disruption should be expected.

Switzerland: environmental demonstrations in Lucerne, Neuchâtel and Zurich on the occasion of the Swiss Climate Strike – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected, tension should not be ruled out.

United Kingdom: Reform UK party conference – Security reinforcements should be expected, demonstrations should not be ruled out.

6 to 7 September

France: Grande Braderie de Lille annual street market - Security reinforcements should be expected.

6 to 14 September

France: 51st edition of the Deauville American Film Festival - Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

6 September

Antilles/Cuba/United States: anniversary of the deadly Hurricane Irma (2017).

Eswatini: National Day.

France: pro-Palestine demonstration in Paris – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Greece: trade union demonstration in Thessaloniki – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Inde: 7th anniversary of the Supreme Court ruling decriminalising homosexuality – Demonstrations should not be ruled out.

Pakistan: Defence Day – Ceremonies and military parades militaires likely.

Poland: anti immigration march in Warsaw – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Spain: demonstration in demand of greater resources to prevent forest fires in Léon – Increased security and disruption should be expected.

United Kingdom: national demonstration in support of Palestine – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

United Kingdom: demonstration in support Scottish independence in Edinburgh – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

United States: anti-Trump demonstration in Washington – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected, counter-demonstrations should not be ruled out. **Zimbabwe**: anniversary of the death of former President Robert Mugabe (2019).

Belgium: "red card" demonstration against Israel in Brussels – Security reinforcements should be expected.

Brazil: Independence Day (1822), military parades likely in Brasilia with President Lula in attendance – Security reinforcements should be expected, including a risk of pro and anti-government demonstrations nationwide.

Fiji: Constitution Day.

Mexico: anniversary of the earthquake measuring 8.2 off the coast of Chiapas (over 100 dead, 2017) - Commemorations possible.

Mozambique: Victory Day (1974).

8 to 12 September

Solomon Islands: meeting of the Pacific Islands Forum.

8 September to 3 October

Switzerland: 60th session of the UN Human Rights Council.

8 September

Andorra: National Day.

France: François Bayrou to give general policy statement and face a vote of confidence in the National Assembly.

Morocco: anniversary of the earthquake measuring 6.8 in Marrakesh (at least 3,000 dead, 2023) – Commemorations possible.

North Macedonia: Independence Day (1991) - Security reinforcements and celebrations likely.

Norway: legislative elections.

Romania: national strike and march by teachers in Bucharest – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Türkiye: hearing on the possible cancellation of the CHP congress – Security reinforcements should be expected, risk of demonstrations.

9 and 10 September

Greece: taxi strike in the Attica region – Travel disruption should be expected.

9 September

Afghanistan: anniversary of the death of Ahmed Shah Massoud (2001).

China: anniversary of the death of Mao Tsé Toung (1976) – Commemorations should be expected.

North Korea: anniversary of the declaration of the Democratic People's

Republic of Korea (1948) - Celebrations should be expected.

Tajikistan: Independence Day (1991).

10 September onwards

France: call for a national protest movement to bring the country to a standstill in protest against the budget of Prime Minister François Bayrou – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

10 September

Central African Republic: conference of CEMAC heads of state

Ivory Coast: publication deadline for the definitive list of presidential election candidates – Opposition demonstrations should not be ruled out.

France: annual State of the Union address by European Commission President Ursula von der at the European Parliament in Strasbourg.

Libya: anniversary of flooding that resulted in loss of life in Derna (2023) - Commemorations possible.

Chile: commemoration of the death of President Salvador Allende (1973) and anniversary of the coup by Augusto Pinochet (1973) – Rallies possible.

Ecuador: demonstrations in Quito led by various social organisations sociales in defence of healthcare, state education, decent work, human rights, the environment and social welfare.

Ethiopia: Ethiopian New Year - Security reinforcements expected.

Libya: 13th anniversary of the terrorist attack on the US Consulate in Benghazi, in which the American ambassador was killed (2012).

Pakistan: anniversary of the death of Muhammad Ali Jinnah (1948) -

Commemorative rallies in Islamabad, Karachi, Lahore and Peshawar should not be ruled out.

Russia: ministerial meeting between Russia and the Gulf Cooperation Council.

Spain: National Day of Catalonia (Diada) - Rallies expected among Catalan supporters of independence, notably led by the ANC, in Barcelona; unrest should not be ruled out.

Türkiye: start of the trial against Ekrem Imamoglu pour "fake diplomas" – Demonstrations should not be ruled out.

United States: anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks on New York and Washington (2001) – Security reinforcements and commemorations likely.

12 September

Ethiopia: 51st anniversary of Emperor Haile Selassie being overthrown by an Ethiopian military junta – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Peru: anniversary of the arrest of the leader of the Shining Path (SL) guerrilla – High risk of attacks.

South Sudan: 7th anniversary of the peace agreement signed in 2018 - Armed incidents should not be ruled out.

13 September

Georgia: opposition demonstration in Tbilisi in protest against the October 2024 election results, the position of the Georgian Dream government on EU membership and the and the subsequent election of Mikheil Kavelashvili as president – Unrest should not be ruled out.

Israel/Palestine: anniversary of the signing of the Oslo Accords (1993) – Risk of demonstrations in the Palestinian Territories.

Kenya: anniversary of William Ruto entering the presidential office (2022) – High risk of anti-government demonstrations, unrest should not be ruled out.

United Kingdom: rally led by supporters of far-right activist, Tommy Robinson and an anti-fascist counter-demonstration in London – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected, risk of unrest.

14 September

Macau (SAR, China): legislative assembly elections.

15 to 19 September

Austria: opening of the IAEA Annual General Conference.

15 September

Bahrain and Morocco: 5th anniversary of the normalisation of relations with Israel – Pro-Palestine demonstrations possible in Manama and Casablanca.

Costa Rica: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations likely.

El Salvador: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations likely.

France: 51st anniversary of the attack on the Publicis Drugstore in Saint-Germain – Commemorations possible.

Guatemala: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations likely.

Honduras: Independence Day (1821) - Celebrations to be expected, opposition demonstrations should not be ruled out, especially in Tegucigalpa.

Mexico: "Grito de Dolores" on the occasion of Independence Day (1810).

Nicaragua: Independence Day (1821) – Opposition rallies should not be ruled out.

Türkiye: court hearing in Ankara concerning alleged corruption during the 2023 election of the leadership of the opposition CHP party – Risk of demonstrations.

United Arab Emirates (UAE): 5th anniversary of the normalisation of relations with Israel - Demonstrations possible within the Muslim world.

United Kingdom: British soldier to stand trial for murder during "Bloody Sunday" – Security reinforcements and tension should not be ruled out.

World: International Day of Democracy – Demonstrations should be expected.

16 September

Algeria: 26th anniversary of the referendum on the Civil Concord Law, which gave amnesty to armed Islamists (1999).

Iran: anniversary of the death of Mahsa Amini, arrested for allegedly wearing her hijab "improperly" – Security reinforcements and demonstrations to be expected, including a high risk of unrest.

Malawi: legislative and presidential elections – Security reinforcements, risk of demonstrations and tension.

Mexico: Independence Day military parade – Security reinforcements and disruption should be expected.

Papua New Guinea: Independence Day (1975) - Commemorations likely.

17 to 19 September

United Kingdom: state visit by US President Donald Trump – Security reinforcements and travel disruption should be expected.

17 September

Greece: anniversary of the start of the Civil War (1946) - Commemorations likely.

18 to 19 September

Chile: Independence Day (18 September) and Day of the Glories of the Army (19 September).

18 September

France: one-day strike and demonstrations led by the trade union confederation (UNSA, CFDT, CGT, FO, CGC, CFTC, Solidaires, FSU) in protest against the budget.

19 September

Haiti: 31st anniversary of the arrival of US soldiers in order to reinstate Haitian President Aristide in Port-au-Prince.

Mexico: anniversary of the earthquake measuring 7.1 in Puebla State (369 dead, 2017) – Commemorations possible.

Nepal: Constitution Day – Celebrations and disruption likely.

Saint Kitts and Nevis: Independence Day (1983) – Disruption likely.

Thailand: anniversary of the coup against Thaksin Shinawatra (2006) – Demonstrations likely.

United Kingdom: anniversary of the referendum on Scottish independence (2014) – Demonstrations possible.

20 September to 5 October

Germany: Oktoberfest in Munich – Disruption and increased security should be expected. **Portugal**: call to demonstrate against the management of forest fires – Rallies should be expected.

Armenia: Independence Day (1991).

Belize: Independence Day (1981).

Ghana: Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Day – Disruption likely on the occasion of

the public holiday.

Guinea: referendum on new constitution.

Kenya: anniversary of the attack on the Westgate Shopping Mall in Nairobi

by Shebab militants (2013) - Commemorations likely.

Malta: Independence Day (1964).

World: International Day of Peace - Demonstrations likely.

Yemen: 11th anniversary of the capture of Sanaa by the Houthis –

Commemorations likely.

22 September

Bulgaria: Independence Day (1908).

Iran/Iraq: anniversary of the start of the Iran-Iraq war (1980-1988), followed

in Iran by Sacred Defence Week with military parades.

Mali: Independence Day.

23 September

Netherlands: ICC hearing to confirm the charges against former Philippine

President Rodrigo Duterte. **Saudi Arabia**: National Day.

24 September

Guinea Bissau: Independence Day (1974) - Celebrations likely.

Kosovo: second anniversary of the Banjska attack - Commemorations should be

expected.

South Africa: Heritage Day.

25 to 27 September

Seychelles: legislative and presidential elections

25 September

France: verdict in the Libyan trial against former President Nicolas Sarkozy and his 11 co-defendants.

Mozambique: Revolution Day (1964) in celebration of the country's armed forces.

26 September

Colombia: 9th anniversary of the peace treaty between the FARC and the Colombian government (2016) – Demonstrations likely.

Mexico: annual march by the families of the missing students of Ayotzinapa in Mexico City.

Myanmar: anniversary of the junta's crackdown on the Saffron Revolution (2007).

World: International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons.

Yemen: anniversary of the 1962 revolution.

Gabon: first round of the legislative and local elections.
